



# Teen Historical Fiction

### ***Chains* by Laurie Halse Anderson**

After being sold to a cruel couple in New York City, a slave named Isabel spies for the rebels during the Revolutionary War.




### ***Fever, 1793* by Laurie Halse Anderson**

In 1793 Philadelphia, sixteen-year-old Matilda Cook, separated from her sick mother, learns about perseverance and self-reliance when she is forced to cope with the horrors of a yellow fever epidemic.

### ***The Astonishing Life of Octavian Nothing* by M.T. Anderson**

Various diaries, letters, and other manuscripts chronicle the experiences of Octavian, a young African American, from birth to age sixteen, as he is brought up as part of a science experiment in the years leading up to and during the Revolutionary War.



### ***Sophia's War* by Avi**

In 1776, after witnessing the execution of Nathan Hale in New York City, newly occupied by the British army, young Sophia Calderwood resolves to do all she can to help the American cause, including becoming a spy.

### ***The Fighting Ground* by Avi**

Thirteen-year-old Jonathan goes off to fight in the Revolutionary War and discovers the real war is being fought within himself.



### ***The Year of the Hangman* by Gary Blackwood**



In 1777, having been kidnapped and taken forcibly from England to the American colonies, fifteen-year-old Creighton becomes part of developments in the political unrest there that may spell defeat for the patriots and change the course of history.

### ***My Brother Sam is Dead* by James Collier**

Recounts the tragedy that strikes the Meeker family during the Revolution when one son joins the rebel forces while the rest of the family tries to stay neutral in a Tory town.


### ***The Ransom of Mercy Carter* by Caroline B. Cooney**

In 1704, in the English settlement of Deerfield, Massachusetts, eleven-year-old Mercy and her family and neighbors are captured by Mohawk Indians and their French allies, and forced to march through bitter cold to French Canada, where some adapt to new lives and some still hope to be ransomed.




### **Alex & Eliza by Melissa De La Cruz**

### **Hamilton and Peggy! By Laura Elliot**

### **Beyond the Burning Time by Kathryn Lasky**

When, in the winter of 1691, accusations of witchcraft surface in her small New England village, twelve-year-old Mary Chase fights to save her mother from execution

### **Woods Runner by Gary Paulsen**

From his 1776 Pennsylvania homestead, thirteen-year-old Samuel, who is a highly-skilled woodsman, sets out toward New York City to rescue his parents from the band of British soldiers and Indians who kidnapped them after slaughtering most of their community.



### **Witch Child by Cecelia Rees**

In 1659, fourteen-year-old Mary Newbury keeps a journal of her voyage from England to the New World and her experiences living as a witch in a community of Puritans near Salem, Massachusetts.

### **The Witch of Blackbird Pond by Elizabeth George Speare**

In 1687 in Connecticut, Kit Tyler, feeling out of place in the Puritan household of her aunt, befriends an old woman considered a witch by the community and suddenly finds herself standing trial for witchcraft.
